



IS IT FAIR?

Take advantage of the data

→ a consistent positive win

Report statistically insignificant results the same way you report statistical significant results.

Otherwise you contribute to under-reporting bias.

- ✓ <u>Main clause</u> + sub ordinate clause
- ✓ End of sentence/ towards the full stop
- ✓ Semantic

- > Although John beats his dog, he is a nice man.
- ✓ Main clause nice man
- ✓ End of sentence –nice man

- > Although John is a nice man, he beats his dog.
- ✓ Main clause –beats his dog
- End of sentence –beats his dog

- o John is a nice man, but he beats his dog.
- ✓ Main clause nice man
- ✓ End of sentence beats his dog

- o John beats his dog, but he is a nice man.
- ✓ Main clause beats his dog
- ✓ End of sentence nice man

• Academic Writing Example

### FACT:

- 30 % increase in productivity
- received 60% positive participant feedback

### OPTIMISTIC VERSION ©

- The study exhibited a remarkable 30% increase in productivity. Notably, the positive impact was consistent across diverse trial conditions, indicating the robustness of our approach.
- Participants positive feedback reflected the userfriendly nature and the immediate applicability in our new methodology.
- These results highlight the potential of our methodology, and overall the results sets promising implementations and research in this domain.

### NOT OPTIMISTIC VERSION (3)

- While there are trends suggest improvements in productivity, but the variability across different trial conditions prompts a careful consideration.
- Participant feedback, while generally positive, a more well-designed approach is necessary for further investigation before drawing definitive conclusions.
- In summary, the experimental results present a mixed conclusion, emphasizing the need for continued research and a cautious approach in applying our methodology in practical settings.

Dear Dr Ratcliffe,

I am very sorry about the long delay in reaching a decision en your manuscript, particularly as in the event we are unable to offer to publish it. As I explained on the telephone, we had great difficulty obtaining referees reports; your manuscript has, however, now been seen by two reviewers whose comments are attached.

While it is clear from the essentially favourable comments of reviewer 1 that your findings will be of interest to others in the field, reviewer 2 is not persuaded that they represent a sufficient advance in our understanding of the mechanisms of genetic response to hypoxia to justify publication in Nature. Given also the discrepancy mentioned by reviewer 1, we have sadly concluded, on balance, that your paper would be better placed in a more specialized journal, particularly given the competition for space.

I realize that this must be from your point of view a very disappointing outcome, particularly after such an unfortunate delay, but we do hope that you will understand our reasons for the decision, and that you will find our reviewers' comments helpful when a new version of your manuscript for resubmission elsewhere.
